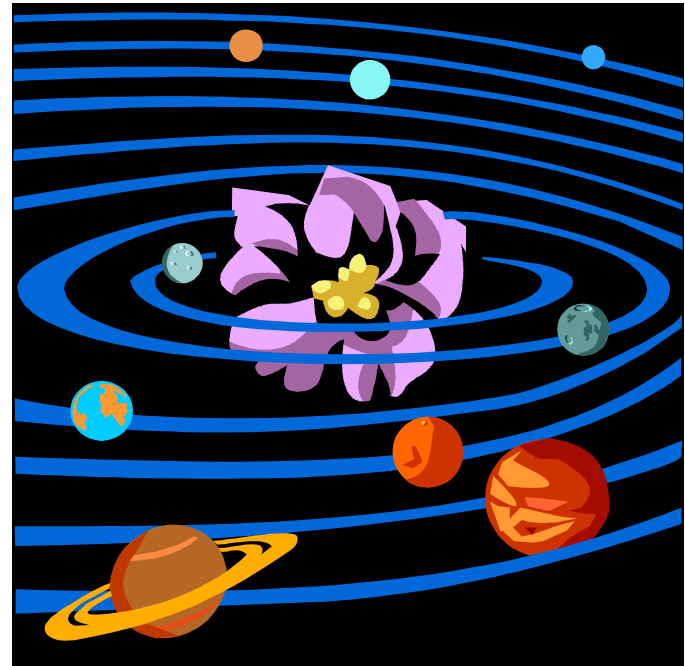

- b. Members of one household are all entitled to membership at the individual dues rate and each shall have membership rights in accordance with his/her participation (see Standing Rule #5). Only one newsletter will be sent to each household.
- c. Membership dues are not transferable to another affiliate chapter.
- d. The Treasurer shall send the Society dues, insurance, and donations to the following:
  - 1. AVSA in October for affiliate dues and insurance.
  - 2. AVCSC affiliate dues of \$15.00 in January and the cost of 2 copies of the California Council News, one each to the President and VCAVS Library.
  - 3. Boyce Edens Research Fund: \$10.00, in January
  - 4. AVSA Booster Fund: \$10.00, in January
  - 5. AVSA Convention Award: \$10.00, in January
  - 6. AVCSC or State Convention Award: \$10.00, in January
  - 7. A donation of \$10.00 is to be sent to the Boyce Edens Research Fund in memory of a deceased member of the VCAVS.

More than the minimum donations or funding for other projects shall be decided by the Board as necessary.
- e. Any member wishing to subscribe to the California Council News may do so by paying the subscription fee to the Treasurer who will send same to the California Council News Distribution Chairman by November of each year.
- f. A donation of \$10.00 is to be sent to the Boyce Edens Research Fund in memory of a deceased member of the VCAVS.

- b. Associate Member denotes a Regular, Honorary, or Commercial Member who is not able to attend meetings regularly due to illness, work or other valid excuse as determined by the Executive Board. Associate members are entitled to receive the newsletter, but may not vote, hold office, or sell plants at Society functions. Members will be placed on Associate Member status and deleted, unless approved by the Board, from the Active Membership Roll after the third consecutive absence from a general meeting. They may be reinstated to Active Member status during the fiscal year without repayment of dues by resuming regular attendance at meetings.

## 6. SALES

- a. Only Active Members or invited club members may sell plants or plant related items at monthly meetings or other Society functions.
- b. A member wishing to sell plants at a Society plant sale should bring at least one blooming plant for the display table.
- c. A member wishing to sell plants at the Society's Annual Show should have at least one entry in the Horticulture or Design Divisions of that Show.
- d. The Plant Sales Chairman will determine a member's eligibility to sell at Society meetings, sales or shows.
- e. Twenty percent (20%) of a member's gross sales at any Society function shall be retained by the Society.
- f. All sales must go through the cashier of the society at the sale.

## 7. INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS

- a. The incoming President may choose the installing officer.
- b. The newly installed President shall be presented with a gift, paid for by the Society and purchased by the outgoing President. They may choose a gavel or other appropriate gift not to exceed \$25.00.
- c. The Society's gavel shall be passed to the newly installed President to be used while in office.

## 8. FISCAL

- a. Dues of \$12.00 per individual and \$14.00 per family yearly membership shall be payable in advance and shall cover the twelve month period of January 1 to December 31, and shall be renewable each October. If not paid by January 1, the member shall be deleted from the Membership Roll. New members joining after July 1 will pay \$6.00 dues for since and \$7.00 dues for family to cover the balance of the year.

We urge anyone who wants to know more about African violets and gesneriads to join the AVSA. Membership runs one year from the date dues are paid and includes six bimonthly issues of the *African Violet Magazine*. The AVSA also publishes the *Handbook for African Violet Growers, Exhibitors, and Judges* which contains the rules we follow for our annual shows as well as many helpful tips on African violet culture.

- c. The Show Theme Committee shall include past participants in Design. The committee shall recommend to the Board in writing a Show theme and an outline of suggested classes. With the Board's approval, these shall be presented to the membership for final approval at the October meeting.
- d. Show properties shall not be made available to any other affiliate club for loan or rental with the exception of the African Violet Council of Southern California.
- e. The newly appointed Show Chairman shall be given a budget and instructions as to basic requirements for expenditures by the Board of Directors.
- f. The Show Chairman shall give to the Secretary, President, and Treasurer a detailed report in writing of all expenditures and information pertaining to the show. The Show Chairman shall give an oral report to the Board and to the membership regarding the operation of the Show.
- g. Any rosettes, ribbons, or trophies awarded to the Society shall be presented to the person who did the work resulting in the award. However, premiums shall be retained by the Society.
- h. Any perpetual plaque will be retained by the person whose name appears most frequently thereon, or in case of a tie, by the last recipient thereof.
- i. Only members may enter the Annual Show.

## **4. MEMBERSHIP CLASSIFICATION**

- a. Regular Membership designates those who have paid dues and provided pertinent information for listing on the Membership Roll and for mailing the newsletter.
- b. Honorary Membership designates those whose dues have been waived by the Society in special recognition of their contribution to the Society.
- c. Commercial Membership designates those persons or firms who have paid dues and advertise consistently and/or sell 1000 or more African violet plants or leaf cuttings annually and/or manufacture or sell fertilizer, disease and pest control products, equipment, or tools related to African violets. Commercial membership confers only one vote.

## **5. MEMBER STATUS**

- a. Active Member denotes a Regular, Honorary, or Commercial Member who attends Society activities regularly and has not missed three or more consecutive general meetings. Active members may vote, hold office, and sell plants at Society functions.

**ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS**

Section 1. These By Laws may be amended by a vote of a majority of members present, providing notice and proposal have been given at a previous regular meeting or have been published in the newsletter prior to voting. Proxy votes must be signed and will be accepted only from active members and only if received by the President at least one day prior to voting.

**ARTICLE IX - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY**

Section 1. *Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised*, shall be the parliamentary authority on all questions not provided for in these By Laws.

# Standing Rules

**1. AMENDMENTS**

- a. A Standing Rule may be amended or adopted by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Publication of the rule shall be presented to the membership in the next newsletter.
- b. Any member wishing to further amend the rule in question may so move from the floor under New Business at a general meeting. Any such motion may be approved by a majority vote of the membership present.

**2. PROGRAMS**

- a. The Program Chairman shall present to the Board for their approval a tentative schedule of programs for the year. This shall be done prior to publication of the yearbook. Any later changes shall be presented to the Board for prior approval.
- b. Speakers shall be compensated up to a maximum of \$25.00 except in special cases which shall be decided by the Board.
- c. Following the August election newly elected officers may start making plans for the next calendar year.

**3. ANNUAL SHOW**

- a. The VCAVS judged show shall be an annual event, unless the Board finds it necessary to make a change.
- b. The President shall appoint a Show Chairman in August. The President and the Show Chairman, with the approval of the Board, shall appoint all other committees. No one person may serve as Chairman of more than one committee except by approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Annual Meeting shall be the October meeting at which time annual reports of all officers and committee chairmen shall be given.

## **ARTICLE VII - NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS**

Section 1. Only active members shall be eligible for nomination for elective office.

Section 2. Candidates for the office of President shall have served as a member of the Board of Directors for a period of one year.

Section 3. All officers of this organization shall hold office for a period of one year and may not serve for more than two consecutive years in the same office except for the Treasurer, who may not serve more than five consecutive years. Following a maximum term in office, a member may be re-elected to the same office after a period of one year or more.

Section 4. A Nominating Committee shall be appointed at the June meeting. The chairman of said committee shall be appointed by the President and two members shall be elected by the membership.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Nominating Committee to secure at least one candidate for each elective office. This slate shall be published in the July newsletter. Nominees for the office shall be presented to the membership at the July meeting by the Chairman of the Nominating Committee. At this same meeting further nominations may be made from the floor with the consent of the person to be nominated. Nominations will close at the conclusion of the July meeting. The entire slate of nominees will be published in the August newsletter.

Section 6. Election of officers shall take place at the August meeting. A majority of all votes cast will determine election to an office. If there is more than one candidate for an office, voting for that office shall be in writing. If there is only one candidate for an office, the Recording Secretary may be instructed to cast a unanimous vote for that office. Proxy votes will be accepted by the Chairman of the Nominating Committee only if signed and received at least one week prior to the election date.

Section 7. Installation of officers shall take place at the November meeting. Newly elected officers shall assume their duties at the January meeting.

chairmen; shall sign all checks with the Treasurer; shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee; and shall enforce the bylaws and all other rules adopted. At the end of the fiscal year, the books shall be audited by the incoming President and a committee of two members appointed by the outgoing President.

Section 2. The Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in his or her absence; shall assist the President; shall sign all checks with the Treasurer, in the absence of the President; and shall be chairman of the Program Committee.

Section 3. The Recording Secretary shall be responsible for keeping accurate, properly recorded minutes of all the meetings of the Society, and shall perform such other duties as fall within the office.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall be responsible for the safekeeping of the Society's funds; shall keep an accurate book record of all moneys received and disbursed; shall pay all bills by check signed by two officers recognized by the bank to sign checks (President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, or any other elected officer); and shall make a monthly report of receipts and disbursements as well as an annual report.

Section 5. The Membership Secretary shall keep an alphabetical file of the membership and attendance; shall enroll new members and collect all annual dues to be handed to the Treasurer each month at the regular meeting of the Society; and shall send notices of all dues; assemble and distribute new member packets to new members.

Section 6. The Director-at-Large shall attend all meetings and shall act as an advocate for the membership. The Director-at-Large shall be Chairman of the By Laws Committee and keep the By Laws and Standing Rules current with actual practices and procedures.

**ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS**

Section 1. The Society shall hold monthly meetings. The Board of Directors shall meet each month unless a meeting is canceled by consensus.

Section 2. One-third of the membership shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. Any three members of the Society may request a special meeting if two weeks' prior notice is given to the President.

be carried on by (i) a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or (ii) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

## ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

Section 1. The elective officers of this organization shall be a President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, and Membership Secretary.

Section 2. There shall be a Director-at-Large; this officer shall be the most previous Past President.

Section 3. The above elected officers and Director-at-Large shall be recognized as the Executive Committee and shall perform the duties of the Board when not in session.

Section 4. Special committees shall be set up as the need arises; chairmen of such committees shall be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board.

## ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall consist of the Executive Committee and appointed Chairmen.

Section 2. They shall have charge of all business and social activities of the Society; shall meet in executive session at a time and place to be designated by the President; shall formulate plans to be presented to the membership for their acceptance or rejection.

Section 3. The members of the Board of Directors shall attend all Board Meetings and assume all duties assigned to them.

Section 4. Any vacancies occurring on the Board of Directors, except that of the President, shall be filled by the Board. In case of a vacancy in the office of President, the Vice President shall assume the office until the next regular election.

Section 5. Eight Board members shall constitute a quorum.

## ARTICLE V - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall have supervision over all of the affairs of this organization; shall preside at all meetings including those of the Board of Directors, Executive Committee and specially called; shall appoint all

# By-Laws

## ARTICLE I - AFFILIATIONS

Section 1. This organization shall be and remain affiliated with the African Violet Society of America, Inc.

Section 2. This organization shall be a member of the African Violet Council of Southern California.

## ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP, DUES AND VOTING

Section 1. All persons who are interested in the growing of African violets shall be eligible for membership in this Society. However, the Board of Directors shall be authorized to expel any member for just cause, of which the Board shall be sole judge. Reinstatement to membership or permission to attend any meeting of the VCAVS must be approved by the Board.

Section 2. The amount of the annual dues for persons holding membership in the Ventura County African Violet Society shall be proposed by the Executive Committee of elected officers and ratified by the membership at large. The fiscal year shall be from January 1 to December 31.

Section 3. Honorary members may be elected to a given number of years upon recommendation of the Board of Directors, and by a two-thirds vote of the members present at a regular meeting.

Section 4. Only active members may hold office and be eligible to vote on all matters brought before the Society.

Section 5. If for any reason the Society should disband, all net funds shall be donated 50% to the Boyce Edens Research Fund and 50% to Ventura County Community College's Horticulture/Floriculture Department. In the event either of these organizations cease to exist, the funds shall be donated to the AVSA Booster Fund.

Section 6. No part of the net earnings of the Society shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers or other private persons, other than in regard to the payment of reasonable compensation for services rendered. No substantial part of the activities of the Society shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation and the Society shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. The Society shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to

# Constitution

## **PREAMBLE**

## **ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS AND ELECTIONS**

Section 1. Annual elections shall be held to select the following officers: President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer and Membership Secretary.

## **ARTICLE V - MEETINGS**

Meetings shall be held monthly except as provided in the By Laws. One meeting shall be designated as the Annual Meeting.

## **ARTICLE VI - AMENDMENTS**

Section 1. This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the membership provided previous notice has been given in writing.

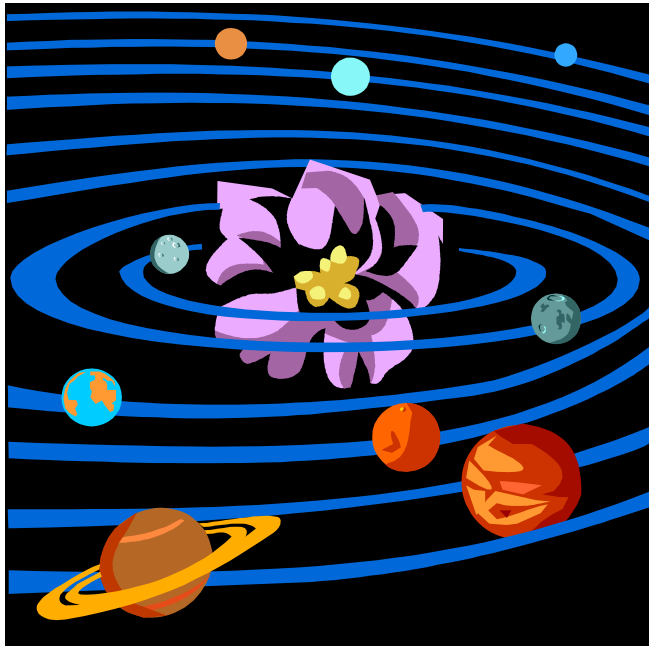
